

Challenges of Image Plagiarism: An Exploration

Image plagiarism, the act of using someone else's image without permission or proper attribution, poses significant challenges due to several factors:

1. Detection Difficulty:

- Visual Similarity: Images can be altered or manipulated, making it difficult to determine if they are exact copies or derivatives of original works.
- Compression and Loss: Image compression and lossy formats can introduce variations that make direct comparison challenging.
- Metadata Manipulation: Metadata, such as EXIF data, can be altered or removed to obscure the original source.

2. Scale and Volume:

- Vast Digital Repositories: The internet is filled with billions of images, making it challenging to manually compare each image for plagiarism.
- Rapid Sharing: Social media and other platforms facilitate the rapid sharing and distribution of images, making it difficult to track their origin.

3. Copyright Complexity:

- Fair Use and Exceptions: Determining whether an image's use falls under fair use or other legal exceptions can be complex and subjective.
- Multiple Rights Holders: In some cases, multiple parties may hold rights to an image, making it difficult to obtain permission from all necessary sources.

4. Global Nature:

- Cross-Border Issues: Plagiarism can occur across international borders, making it challenging to enforce copyright laws and address disputes.
- Cultural Differences: Different countries have varying copyright laws and enforcement practices, further complicating the issue.

5. Technological Advancements:

• Deepfakes and AI: The development of deepfake technology and AI-generated images can make it even more difficult to distinguish between original and manipulated content.

6. Attribution and Credit:

- Uncredited Sources: Many images are shared online without proper attribution, making it difficult to trace their origin and give credit to the original creator.
- Misattribution: In some cases, images may be attributed to the wrong person or source, leading to confusion and inaccuracies.

To address these challenges, various approaches are being developed, including:

- Automated Detection Tools: Using algorithms to compare images and identify similarities.
- Watermarking and Fingerprinting: Embedding unique identifiers into images to help track their origin.
- Education and Awareness: Raising awareness about copyright issues and promoting responsible image usage.
- Legal Frameworks: Strengthening copyright laws and enforcement mechanisms.
- Collaborative Efforts: Developing international standards and cooperation to address global challenges

By addressing these challenges, we can help protect the rights of creators and ensure the integrity of digital content.

Face-to-Face

Dr. Vikas S. Nagrale, a leading library professional, joined India's prestigious Central University, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi last year. We spoke to Dr. Nagrale about his professional journey and his vision for Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi.



BI: Please describe your professional journey.

Ans: With about total 22 years of experience, I joined the prestigious Jamia Millia Islamia, in the year 2023 as University Librarian. Prior to this I worked as a librarian at the Anjuman College of Engineering and Technology. Nagpur, (ACET) Managed by Anjuman Hami-E-Islam, Nagpur, which is a prestigious minority institution in India established in 1888, affiliated to RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur. I also have experience as a Lecturer at the Mahila Mahavidyalay, Gadchiroli, Maharastra.

BI: Please share with us your contribution to the library Professional during the Last 22 Years.

Ans: Certainly! Over the past 22 years, I have dedicated myself to advancing the library profession through a variety of roles and initiatives.

I have actively participated in and led numerous workshops and training sessions aimed at enhancing the skills of library staff. This includes topics such as digital literacy, emerging technologies, and effective patron engagement. I have been instrumental in implementing and managing new technologies within library systems like integrated library systems (ILS), digital cataloguing tools, and user-friendly online databases.

Recognizing the significance of libraries as community hubs, I have developed and led various outreach programs to connect with various populations, such as, organizing community events, establishing partnerships with local organizations, and creating modified programs for underserved groups. Working with policymakers to support library grant, participating in professional organizations to influence library values, and contributing to policy development to address growing challenges in the field, have been some other areas of my interest.

By offering guidance, sharing experiences, and providing profession advice, I have helped shape the potential of the profession and fostered a helpful network within the library society.

I have regularly contributed to LIS literature and my work has been shared through academic journals conference presentations, and professional forums, contributing to the ongoing dialogue and development in the field.

BI: You're Comments on changing Information needs of the researchers and response of the publishing industry.

The criteria for publishing are changing and it is a challenge to publish your research promptly. The need for publishing is increasing from a human-centric viewpoint to a scientific one for the welfare of society. Hence, everyone needs information very much and fast. Researchers' information needs are progressively more focused on real-time access, interdisciplinary content, and high-quality, open-access resources. The publishing industry is moving to a digital model, improving search and finding tools and supporting open access to meet these emerging demands. This transformation aims to enhance access, accelerate dissemination, and better support various research workflows.

BI: What plans do you have for Jamia Millia Islamia University Library in terms of resources and services in the coming years? Please share your thoughts as a University Librarian.

While sustaining its excellence, my focus is on planning to build a visionary library that will support the academic mission of the university, adopt technological advancements and enhance user experience. I want to create a strategic plan that includes resources and services. After conducting a thorough assessment of the current resources, user needs, I think a strategic plan should be developed based on this assessment.

Creating an institutional repository to store and showcase the university's research output, upgrading the LMS with a cloud-based system to improve the user experience, regular workshops on information literacy, research skills and effective use of digital resources are some major areas of my priority.

I aim to improve physical spaces based on user needs, focusing on creating different areas for quiet study, collaborative work, and multimedia use. I plan to expand on the technology-based special collections or archives we already have related to university history, area studies, and important research areas. I am also working on developing RFID tagging systems for book tracking and self-checkout stations to streamline library operations, and mobile-friendly access to library resources through a mobile app.

BI: Please share your views on your role on INFLIBNET as an eminent University Librarian member of the Governing Board of INFLIBNET.

Ans: First of all I would like to thank the Hon'ble Chairman of the University Grants Commission of India for nominating me as an eminent University Librarian member of the Governing Board of INFLIBNET.

As an eminent University Librarian serving on the Governing Board of INFLIBNET, my role would be both strategic and collaborative. 
